How the world has changed since our last newsletter. Even as we write this many countries are still in lock down. For us it has meant that until last week we have had no visitors for three and a half months. We have been in our home here now for over seventeen years and during that time hardly a week has gone by when we haven't had visitors or people staying with us. In fact we were supposed to have a missionary come stay with us this last month but this too had to be cancelled.

We are fortunate that we are having some nice weather now and are able to meet out in the back yard (while observing the two metre rule!) and have had a number of 'conversations' over the front fence.

Over the last couple of months Peter and Benjamin have been able to put their practical skills to use in helping different folk out. This too had it's challenges as we maintained our social distancing.

We are thankful for modern technology as we have been able to keep in touch and do bible studies etc through email and Skype. Still it's not quite the same as meeting in person.

Yet in all this we are so much better off than some. Here is a prayer request we just received from some friends who work in a country not mentioned in the news... *"Please do lift up this country's situation. Covid is absolutely rampant here. So many people we know have come down with it, and the hospitals are no longer taking people, and emergency responders are not responding. It is not a good situation."*

# Ministry Matters

We would like to share a wee testimony from Elaina on the impact her bible studies has had for one lady. "A stone drops in the pond. The ripples circle out. Our own small influences do the same, and we may not even see the impact the ripple has. I gave a book, called Praying the Scriptures for Your Adult Children by Jodie Berndt, to a lady at church. She has been blessed so much so by its content, and in learning how to pray more effectively for her son and others. She spoke with a friend who shared about her own daughter who was struggling with infertility issues. Remembering a chapter that dealt with this very thing, the lady made a copy of it and gave it to her friend, encouraging her to pray for her daughter. This was sometime ago. The lady called me recently to tell me of this, and to add that her friend was emboldened to pray for her daughter, who is now expecting a baby! The lady was so excited. She has been privileged to see many answered prayers for those she has shared with and encouraged to pray. For me, I am encouraged as the "impact ripple" points others to pray to God with intent, for their families"
